A Personal Note

At the time of this writing, your Call Committee has recommended to the Board of Directors a call meeting to be held early in May. Just a few updates regarding the pastoral call process. Holy Trinity is part of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), and as such we have pledged that we will call only from the official roster of pastors kept by the LCMS. There are nearly 6000 congregations being served by LCMS pastors, approximately 10% of which (including Holy Trinity today) have a vacancy in the pastoral office at any given time.

Our Mid-South District of the LCMS (located in Tennessee, serving KY, TN, and AR churches) assists in providing lists of pastoral candidates who are eligible to receive a call. Call committees review these lists and sift through the names, trying to determine which candidates would be the "best fit" for their local church. These names are presented to a meeting of the congregation, which is the group charged with offering a call.

At an upcoming meeting of Holy Trinity's general assembly, the voters of the church (members over the age of 18) will be able to exercise their power to elect a candidate. After this is done, the pastor-elect will have time to consider and accept or decline our call. The whole process is bathed in prayer, and we believe the Holy Spirit directs our actions in this regard. Please pray fervently that Holy Trinity will soon be able to welcome and install our new senior pastor, whoever he may be.

Smiths Grove Site Outreach

Worship services continue each week at the Smiths Grove site (First Christian Church, 427 College Street). They take place each Saturday at 5 PM. Prior to worship, Bible study is held at 4 PM. Thanks to all of our Holy Trinity members who have attended and prayed and provided various means of support to this outreach ministry! The very special observance of the Easter Vigil took place with hearty thanksgiving – a wonderful service that everyone should experience once before seeing the Lamb face to face!

Please continue your prayers that this outreach would provide more open doors for the Gospel and that the Spirit will lead many to worship the risen Savior. If you are living (or know someone who is living) around Smiths Grove, let us know so that we can contact them. Here is a church home where people know one another and love to serve the Lord Jesus.





Hello? Hello? Can someone answer the NEW PHONE please? We finally have a new phone system installed and working! Woohoo! Thank you to John Heinze for his work to help research options, remove the old system, and help install the new. John was also the person who gave us our old system that served us well for many years. The school paid \$8,870.00 for the new system and installation.

Let's hope it lasts as long as the old one did! At their April board meeting, the School Ministry Team voted to partner with our PTO program and pay for some much needed renovations and a new stove for the kitchen. Between the school and the PTO, \$20,000 has been approved for the remodeling of the gym bathrooms and the replacing of partitions and faucets in the preschool bathrooms. The board also voted to partner with PTO to purchase a new oven for the kitchen at a cost of approximately \$13,000. We are thankful to our PTO and their fundraising efforts that help to enhance the Christian education experience for our students and families.

This month will fly by with so many activities on the calendar. We have testing, preschool graduation, Kindergarten circus, 6th grade graduation, AR dance parties, 5/6 grade class trip, Field Day, Awards assemblies, etc., etc. May seems to be gone in a blink and a much welcomed break helps our staff recoup and gear up for the next year.

God has been so good to HTLS and has blessed us in so many ways. We give Him all glory for guiding us and keeping us CONNECTED (them for the year). May these blessings result in reaching more children and families with the Good News.

KIDS' ACTIVITIES 13

a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes




What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase.






